

Do you have a misdemeanor or felony case and are looking for a fresh start?
 You may qualify if:

- You were not formally charged or prosecuted within 12 months of your arrest;
- The case was dismissed;
- The charges were dropped;
- There was no disposition of the case;
- The case was Remanded to File;
- You received an Order of Nolle Prosequi (Not prosecuted);
- The case was No Billed (Not indicted);
- You were sentenced to Pre-Trial Diversion;
- You were placed on Non-Adjudicated probation; or
- You were sentenced to Drug Court.



“KNOW YOUR RIGHTS” EXPUNGEMENT WORKSHOP

Any person who has been convicted of one of the following felonies may petition the court of conviction for an order to expunge one conviction from all public records 5 years after the successful completion of all terms and conditions of the sentence for the conviction:

- Bad check offense (Miss. Code Ann. §97-19-55)
- Possession of a controlled substance or paraphernalia (Miss. Code Ann. § 41-29-139(c) or (d))
- False pretense (Miss. Code Ann. §97-19-39)
- Larceny (Miss. Code Ann. § 97-17-41)
- Malicious mischief (Miss. Code Ann. § 97-17-67)
- Shoplifting (Miss. Code Ann. §97-23-93)

If your record can be expunged, please bring the following information and documents to the legal workshop:

- (1) Your driver’s license or state issued ID;
- (2) Record(s) of any previous expungement;
- (3) A copy of your sentencing order and copies of any and all documents related to the incident you want to be expunged;
- (4) Disposition (sentence);
- (5) Date of disposition; and
- (6) Proof that terms of sentence have been completed/complied with – obtain abstract from court to show that you have completed the terms. Can also obtain certificate showing that you have completed terms of probation.
